UMAT Attention Year 12 Students - PLANNING TO STUDY MEDICINE, PHARMACY, PHYSIOTHERAPY, DENTISTRY, OPTOMETRY, HEALTH SCIENCES?

Year 12 students planning to apply for these courses must complete the **Undergraduate Medicine and Health Sciences Admission Test (UMAT)**. UMAT test results are used as part of the selection process for medicine, dentistry and health science degree programs at various UMAT Consortium universities. UMAT 2016 will be held on Wednesday 27 July 2016. Note that UMAT is offered once a year only. Registrations for UMAT 2016 are now open. Registrations will close at 5.00pm 3 June 2016. ADFA EDUCATION AWARD - Closes 28 February The Australian Defence Force Academy (ADFA) Education Award is presented annually to Year 12 students in recognition of leadership potential, and academic and sporting achievements exhibited during Year 11. The award comprises of a tablet device (or similar) and certificate for you, along with a plaque of recognition for your school.

Award eligibility To be eligible to apply for the Education Award, you must currently be studying Year 11 subjects that meet both the educational qualifications for admission to the University of New South Wales (UNSW) and **submit an application prior to 28 February in the year you undertake Year 12.** For more information visit:

This includes students doing Vocational Education Training (VET) programs in school, an Australian School based apprenticeship and additional training that includes VET competencies such as white card and asbestos.
