

## College Program for Year 10 at MCSS

The MCSS Year 10 College program is unique to ACT Government Colleges. The program allows Year 10 students to undertake a Year 11 unit of study. This unit will be credited towards their Senior Secondary Certificate. Students will still achieve their Year 10 Certificate.

This opportunity will allow students to:

- Broaden the depth of their studies
- Strengthen their pathways to employment by commencing their Year 12 Certificate earlier
- Develop vocational competencies by undertaking VET courses not available to them in the high school
- Access courses not available in the high school
- Trial a college course before they start Year 11.

At the end of the program students will be awarded a grade for each completed unit.

Students in the Year 10 College Program will need to be motivated and have the skills necessary for this level of work. Students will need to have this choice approved by parents, the relevant teacher and Year 10 Advisors.

Subjects are available to students where their Year 10 subjects allow.

## College Program for Year 10 at MCSS

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### College Program: Year 10

The College Program is an opportunity for Year 10 students to undertake a college unit during Year 10. This unit will be credited towards their Senior Secondary Certificate.

This opportunity will allow students to:

- the depth of their program
- motivation to their Year 10 studies
- their pathways to employment by commencing work towards their Senior Secondary Certificate earlier
- vocational competencies by undertaking VET courses not available to them in their Year 10 environment
- courses not available in their high school
- a course to see if they wish to study it further when they start Year 11.

Students may study selected course types including Vocational Courses. Students will be awarded a grade for each completed Year 11 unit. These units will count towards the Senior Secondary Certificate.
